<u>The Yurrandaali (Goanna) Room</u>

Over the past few weeks The Yurrandaali Room have certainly worked with many and varied teachers and leaders whilst I was away. They enjoyed working on 3D shapes making them before working out the faces, vertices and edges and finally looking at the cross sections. Then they used grids to draw different views including top, front and side. They also worked on some 3D shape building with Mrs Baldo as seen in photos with the yummy marshmallows.

In Literacy the students have chosen their own individual picture book to work with in writing. We have identified the purpose as well as the language features used by the author. The students then looked at the structure to identify what we know about the type of text. Then the students made choices as to how they could use the text to write two pieces of writing for themselves as either informative, imaginative or persuasive. The class produced some great pieces such as instructions for Pin The Tail On The Donkey, a wide variety of animal reports and discussions about various topics.

In PE we continue to work as a democracy voting on games to develop our skills and we also had a wonderful skills drill with Sam for Sport to build upon our knowledge of cricket skills from the last few weeks. Carly continues to build strength and agility and ideas for relaxation and meditation. Great opportunities for our students!!



<u>The Bandaarr (Grey Kangaroo) Room</u>

Bandaarr class have been working hard in all activities over the last couple of weeks and we can't believe we are in our last week of Term 3. We have been learning that mistakes can help us to learn. Giving things a go can help us to grow and get better at things we might find hard to do at first. I am very proud of the way our class are becoming more independent in their learning habits to be the best learners they can be.

In literacy, we have been learning how we can use alliteration in our writing to describe characters' appearance, mannerisms and personalities. We have had some great writing based on our new class pets called Sea Monkeys. We have named them using alliteration and look forward to caring for them and watching them grow.

In numeracy, year 1 and 2 have been learning about teen numbers and they made rain chains to show they are made up of 10 plus some more. Aleanah and Aaron were very proud of themselves for creating a great teen number display for our classroom.

Year 3 have been working on 2, 3 and 4 multiplication tables using an interactive 120 chart to represent skip counting and patterns.

We are continuing with our geography unit on people and places and walked through the village last week observing buildings, parks, and other features of our community. We had great discussions on why buildings were built, who uses them and cares for these places.

Now that the weather is warming up, we have started to create an indoor class garden. We will move outdoors to plant and grow vegetables next term. We are looking forward to using what we grow in our cooking classes.
