

#### What works best in education?

Our school is committed to ensuring that how we teach your child is based on what we know makes the biggest difference to their learning. Some of the most significant research into effective teaching is detailed in a report called 'What Works Best' which outlines eight evidenced based practices that teachers can use in their classrooms to support improved student learning. In the upcoming editions of our newsletters, we will give our families a summary of the eight evidenced based practices and ways that you can check in with your child. Below is the second summary 'Explicit Teaching' from the eight 'What Works Best' practices for effective teaching, including some conversation tips to help you support these practices at home.

## What Works Best Theme: Explicit Teaching

Students learn best when teaching is explicit, especially when learning something new. Explicit teaching involves teachers clearly explaining to students why they are learning something, how it connects to what they already know, what they expect students to do, how to do it and what it looks like when they have succeeded.

## What Works Best Theme Questions: Check in with your child

Tell me about something you learnt today.

Did you find it easy to learn, or did you need to ask a few questions? How could you tell when you 'got it'?

## **Attendance Matters**

We want to do all we can to be sure your child achieves their potential and enjoys being in school. By attending school every day your child will get the most out of their learning and improve their career and life options. When your child is absent it is important you let the school know, including the reason why, on the day or the day before. This helps make sure we know where our students are and allows us to offer support for you and your family if needed.
